Tree anatomy: Wood layers

Kit for activity contains: Guide for Teachers/Parents, Complete drawing with labels, Activity sheet

Purpose:

Learn the names of different parts of the wood and their function.

Materials Needed:

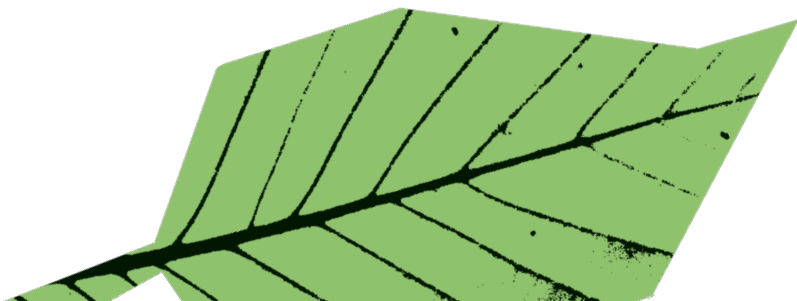
- Printable black-and-white diagrams of a tree with labeled parts.
- Crayons, colored pencils, or markers.

Instructions:

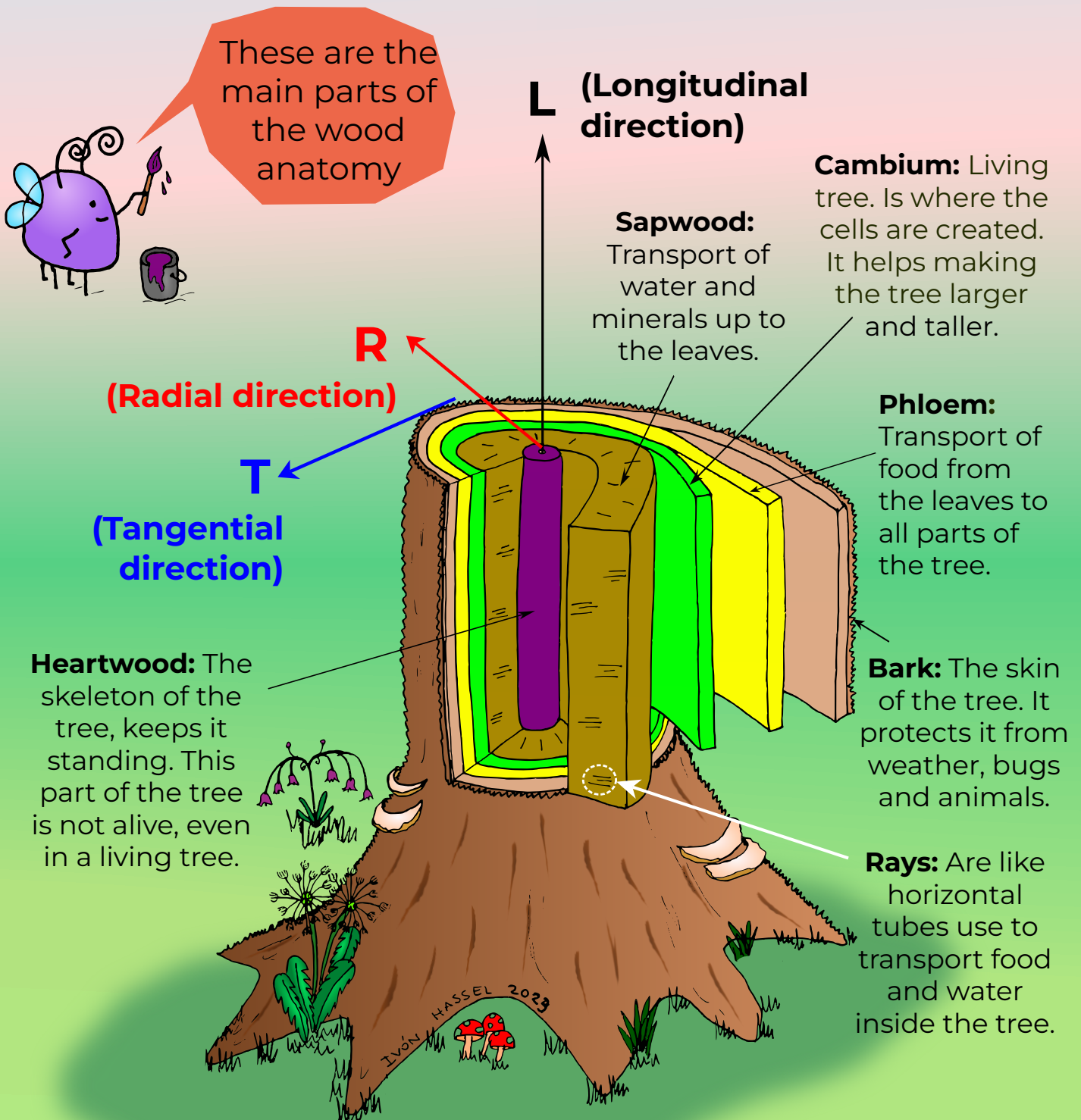
- Read the descriptions given in the full-colored page with the children. Encourage discussion and understanding by asking them questions.
- Provide children with the coloring page.
- Encourage them to color each part carefully, perhaps using different colors for different parts.
- Have children label the parts themselves, and write a short description with their own words.

Optional:

- Create a “My Tree Journal” where children draw their own trees and label the parts.
- Ask questions like, “Which part do you think is the most important?”



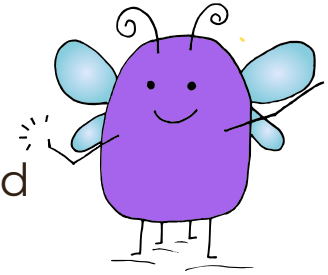
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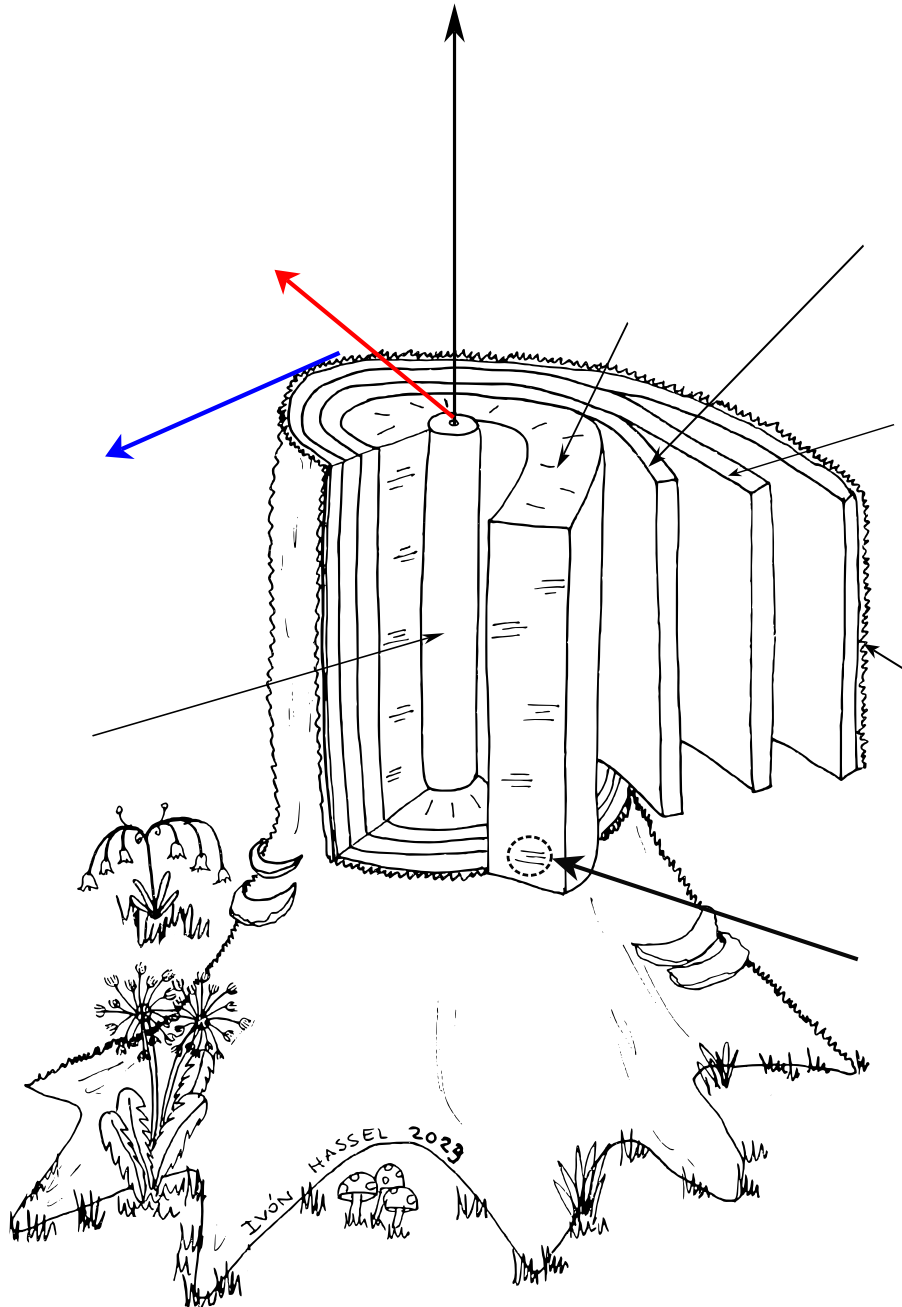
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Activity:
